Why Neufer?

- Prevents unwanted pregnancies and the cost associated with a litter of puppies
- Prevents some cancers and eliminates the risk of womb infections (pyometra), which can be very expensive to treat and potentially fatal
- Avoids risk of phantom pregnancies
- In male dogs, castration *may* help to prevent some undesirable behaviours such as urine marking, straying and excessive mounting
- Neutered males may be less likely to show aggression towards other male dogs or be the target of aggression from other dogs

Dogs may be neutered from a young age. Speak to your vet for advice about when to neuter your dog.

Please note, the fee for neutering a dog under the Dogs Trust's neutering scheme is intended to cover the entire procedure for healthy dogs.
